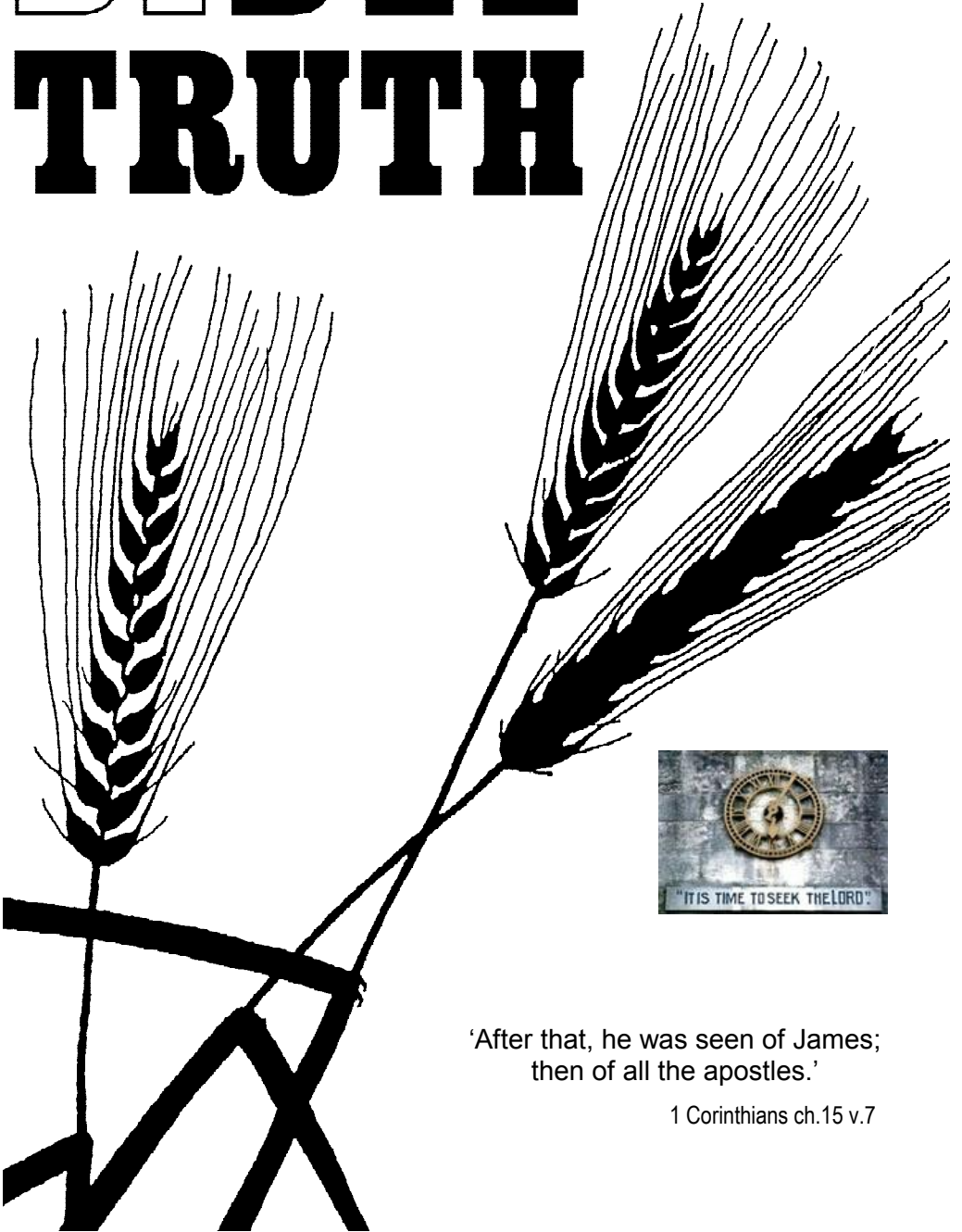

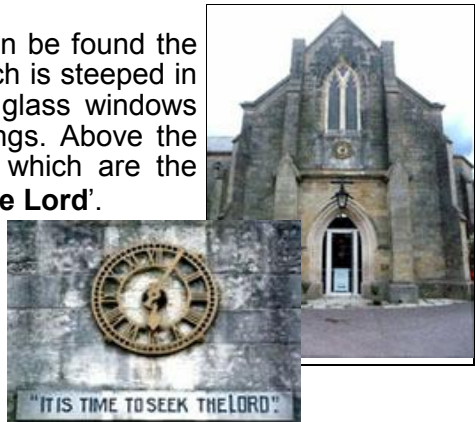
Holidaying in Devon - Sidmouth



This town in south Devon is a seaside tourist resort and a gateway to the Jurassic Coast World Heritage Site.

Near the edge of the town can be found the beautiful church of All Saints which is steeped in history with its array of stained glass windows and beautiful ornate internal fittings. Above the entrance door is a clock below which are the fitting words '**It is time to seek the Lord**'.

The church is of the evangelical tradition with good biblical teaching being home to a friendly and welcoming Christian community, with services at 9.15 (Summer 9.45) & a traditional service at 11.15 am.



On Salcombe Hill, Sidmouth is the Norman Lockyer Observatory and Planetarium. Lockyer was the world's first professor of astronomical physics at the Royal College of Science and is perhaps better known for his astronomical interpretations of ancient and prehistoric sites, especially Stonehenge. This science education project is open to the public.

On the seafront, 'Jacob's Ladder' is a series of wooden steps and leads up to Connaught Gardens sitting on red cliffs.

Over the hill to the west of Sidmouth lies Raleigh Country where in 1552 the renowned Elizabethan Sir Walter Raleigh (see p.20) was born in Hayes Barton farmhouse at East Budleigh. His family had settled here in 1537 and Walter's father was a church warden of the Church of All Saints at East Budleigh. The oldest memorial in the church is one to the memory of Joan the first wife of Walter's father with the Raleigh pew on the left side of the nave.
